

SYNCHRONOUS

• Live, secure, real time interactive "face to face" communications. Often referred to as video conferencing. The patient/student/client is present.

ASYCHRONOUS

 Store and forward types of information such as medical images, video captures, chat, IM or email.
 The patient/student/client is not present.

- 7. Prepare and Practice!



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Tips for Writing Telehealth Goals


- 1. How can I help the child to be the most functional as possible at home or in their natural environment?




